

ARTS DISASTER RECOVERY RESOURCES

For Artists and Arts Organizations:

You and/or your organization may be eligible for FEMA assistance if you are in an area designated under a federally declared disaster. Self-employed individuals may be eligible for federal Individual Assistance to replace tools of the trade lost or damaged; see the *Quick Reference Guide* (https://www.ncaper.org/_files/ugd/cd44f9_ce808c2fc63e4ef9ada15203345beacc.pdf).
